
2012-2022 Occupational Projections Summary

Region 10’s occupational employment is expected to increase by 12.1% from 2012 to 2022 (or 1.21% annually). Job growth will vary across major occupational groups depending on the industry. Service-providing occupations are generally expected to outperform goods-producing occupations. This is reflected in both employment change and growth rates.

Major occupational groups expected to grow faster than the regional annual average are business and financial (1.4%); computer and mathematical (1.4%); community and social service (2.0%); legal (1.3%); education (1.3%); arts, design, entertainment, sports, and media (1.3%); healthcare practitioner (1.8%); healthcare support (2.2%); food prep and serving (1.2%); building/grounds cleaning and maintenance (1.5%); personal care (2.4%); construction (2.4%); installation, maintenance, and repair (1.5%), and transportation and material moving (1.5%). Growing less than the regional average include management (0.1%); architecture and engineering (0.2%); life, physical, and social science (1.2%); protective service (0.8%); sales (1.0%); office and administrative (1.0%); farming, fishing, and forestry (0.6%); and production (1.0%) major occupational groups. A detailed look of 2012-2022 major occupational trends follows.

Region 10’s Occupations with the Largest Projected Job Growth, 2012-2022

Region 10’s top ten occupations expected to have the largest employment growth for 2012-2022 will account for 9,395 (or 28%) of the projected 33,730 new jobs. The major occupational groups of health; sales; food prep and serving; personal care; office and administrative; and transportation and material moving will account for 8,730 (or 93%) of the 9,395 new jobs as shown below.




Region 10's Occupations with the Largest Projected Job Decline, 2012-2022

Region 10 expects nine occupations to account for an employment decline of 1,585 jobs for 2012-2022. The farmers, ranchers, and other agricultural managers occupation will account for 1,275 (or 80%) of the 1,585 jobs as shown below.

Region 10's Fast Growing Occupations, 2012-2022

Region 10's top ten occupations expected to have the largest percentage of employment growth for 2012-2022 are primarily in the healthcare and personal care major occupational groups as shown below. In conjunction with strong growth, occupational employment levels are to be reviewed in determining the largest number of job openings.



Region 10's Fast Declining Occupations, 2012-2022


Region 10 expects the postal mail carrier, engineering techs, and farm management occupations to have the largest percentage of employment decline for 2012-2022 as shown below.

Employment costs, competition, technological change and other economic factors may contribute to deteriorating industry employment. While such occupations may be considered a source for employment, careful thought should be given to training time and costs.

Region 10's Occupations with the Most Annual Openings, 2012-2022

Region 10's top ten occupations expected to have the most annual openings for 2012-2022 will account for 2,565 (or 26%) of the projected 9,920 openings. The major occupational groups of food prep and serving; sales; office and administrative; and transportation and material moving will account for 2,020 (or 79%) of the 2,565 openings as shown below.



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
