
2012-2022 Occupational Projections Summary

Region 11’s occupational employment is expected to increase by 14.2% from 2012 to 2022 (or 1.42% annually). Job growth will vary across major occupational groups depending on the industry. Service-providing occupations are generally expected to outperform goods-producing occupations. This is reflected in both employment change and growth rates.

Major occupational groups expected to grow at or faster than the regional annual average are business and financial (1.8%); computer and mathematical (2.7%); community and social service (1.8%); healthcare practitioner (2.1%); healthcare support (2.2%); building/grounds cleaning and maintenance (1.7%); personal care (2.3%); construction (2.6%); installation, maintenance, and repair (1.5%); and transportation and material moving (1.5%). Growing less than the regional average include management (0.5%); architecture and engineering (1.3%); life, physical, and social science (1.1%); legal (1.4%); education (1.2%); arts, design, entertainment, sports, and media (1.2%); protective service (1.1%); food prep and serving (1.2%); sales (1.3%); office and administrative (1.2%); farming, fishing, and forestry (0.8%); and production (1.0%) major occupational groups. A detailed look of 2012-2022 major occupational trends follows.

Region 11’s Occupations with the Largest Projected Job Growth, 2012-2022

Region 11’s top 10 occupations expected to have the largest employment growth for 2012-2022 will account for 13,235 (or 20%) of the projected 64,620 new jobs. The major occupational groups of healthcare; food prep and serving; sales; personal care; office and administrative; and transportation and material moving will account for 9,990 (or 75%) of the 13,235 new jobs as shown below.




Region 11's Occupations with the Largest Projected Job Decline, 2012-2022

Region 11 expects eleven occupations to account for an employment decline of 2,730 jobs for 2012-2022. Occupations in management and office and administrative will account for 2600 (or 95%) of the 2,730 jobs as shown below.

Region 11's Fast Growing Occupations, 2012-2022

Region 11's top ten occupations expected to have the largest percentage of employment growth for 2012-2022 are primarily in the healthcare; personal care; and; and arts, design, entertainment, sports, and media major occupational groups as shown below. In conjunction with strong growth, occupational employment levels are to be reviewed in determining the largest number of job openings.




Region 11's Fast Declining Occupations, 2012-2022

Region 11 expects the postal service, reporters and correspondents, and farm management occupations to have the largest percentage of employment decline for 2012-2022 as shown below. Employment costs, competition, technological change and other economic factors may contribute to deteriorating industry employment. While such occupations may be considered a source for employment, careful thought should be given to training time and costs.

Region 11's Occupations with the Most Annual Openings, 2012-2022

Region 11's top 10 occupations expected to have the most annual openings for 2012-2022 will account for 3,810 (or 22%) of the projected 17,250 openings. The major occupational groups of sales; healthcare; food prep and serving; and office and administrative will account for 3,035 (or 80%) of the 3,810 openings as shown below.
