# QUAD CITIES REGIONAL LABORSHED ANALYSIS


A Laborshed is defined as the area or region from which an employment center draws its commuting workers. To determine the approximate boundaries of a Laborshed area, local employers supply the residential ZIP codes of each of their employees. This regional analysis is based on aggregate data from the Clinton County, Muscatine and Quad Cities Laborshed studies (1,559 total completed surveys).

## OCCUPATIONS AND EMPLOYMENT STATUS IN THE QUAD CITIES REGION



Survey respondents from the Quad Cities Region were asked to identify their current job title and the industry in which they are currently working. The largest concentration of workers are employed within the office and administrative support; production; or management occupational categories. The top industries are manufacturing; healthcare/social services; wholesale & retail trade; and education.

The chart below shows the percentage of respondents by employment status within the Quad Cities Regional commuting area.

The underemployed are individuals who are working fewer than 35 hours per week but desire more hours; are working in positions that do not meet their skill or education level, or have worked for higher wages at previous employment; or are working at wages equal to or less than the national poverty level and are working 35 or more hours per week.






## EMPLOYED - LIKELY TO CHANGE EMPLOYMENT

- 27.1% are likely to change employment
- 14.3% are working multiple jobs
- Currently working an average of 42 hours per week
- Average age is 46 years old
- 27.9% currently working in the professional, paraprofessional & technical occupational category, followed by 27.6% in the production, construction & material handling occupational category


Those who are employed likely to change employment in the Quad Cities Regional Laborshed area are willing to commute an average of 26 miles one-way for employment opportunities.

## TOP BENEFITS OF FULL-TIME EMPLOYED



The survey provides respondents an opportunity to identify employment benefits they are currently offered. The chart at right shows the percentage of those who are employed full-time that receive each benefit.

The majority (72.2%) of full-time employed respondents state they are currently sharing the cost of health insurance premiums with their employer while 12.5 percent indicate their employer covers the entire cost.



## EDUCATION LEVELS AND MEDIAN WAGES BY INDUSTRY



## UNEMPLOYED - LIKELY TO ACCEPT EMPLOYMENT


- 11.1% of the region are unemployed\*
- 69.4% have become unemployed within the last year
- 72.4% are likely to accept employment
- Average age is 45 years old
- 62.6% are male and 37.4% are female
- **Education:**
  - 61.0% have some post high school education



- **Wages:**
  - \$14.00/hr - to attract 66% of applicants
  - \$15.63/hr - to attract 75% of applicants
  - \$11.75/hr - lowest median wage willing to accept
- Willing to commute an average of 24 miles one way for the right opportunity
- 64.8% expressed interest in temporary and 58.2% in seasonal employment opportunities
- 59.0% expressed interest in working varied shifts
