Decorah, IA – Iowa Workforce Development Director Elisabeth Buck and Deputy Director Joe Walsh visited the Decorah office Thursday, June 17th. They discussed Iowa’s state and county unemployment numbers, general employment issues affecting the area and the integrity of Iowa Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund.
